'Student Voice Postcards' is on again, in Term 3.

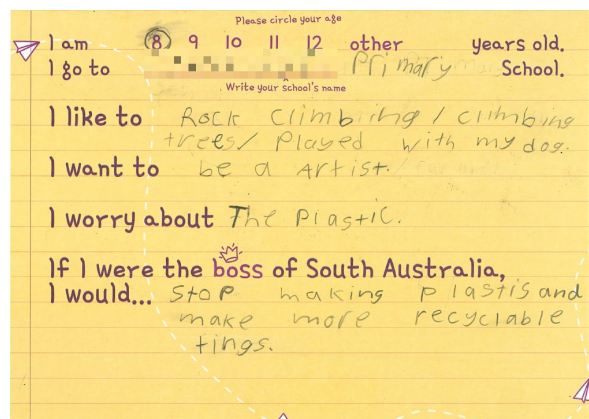
An initiative of SA's Children's Commissioner.
